Doctoral candidate

The successful candidate is expected to conduct their doctoral thesis within the social psychology research group "Intergroup relations and social identity" under the supervision of Vincenzo Iacoviello, PhD and Clara Kulich, PhD. The thesis is financed in the context of a Swiss National Science Foundation (FNS) project on "Should I be a caring man or a dominant man?": Men's normative ambivalence toward masculinity" (grant N°10000799) which also includes a post-doctoral researcher, as well as international collaborators. The project looks at how men experience and manage antagonistic norms related to their masculinity. The research will involve conducting interviews with men with the aim of developing a scale on conflicting norms of masculinity, and conducting quantitative studies to validate the scale.

Vacancy details: Doctoral research position; Duration: up to 4 years; Start date: 1st of August 2024 (or as agreed upon). The salary and working conditions follow the regulations of the Swiss National Science Foundation.

Requirements:

- Master's degree in psychology
- Excellent knowledge and interest in social psychology, intergroup relations, and possibly masculinity and/or social norms
- Excellent knowledge of quantitative methods and use of statistical software (e.g., SPSS, R); knowledge of qualitative methods is a bonus
- Native speaker (or similar) in French and fluent in English (written and oral)
- Ability to work independently, as a team player, and in collaboration with international project partners
- Participation in the doctoral program in social psychology coordinated by the Universities of Geneva and the University of Lausanne

Employer: The position is based at the University of Geneva (UNIGE), the second largest of Switzerland with more than 18,000 students (162 different nationalities represented, and 38% of international students). UNIGE also hosts and co-hosts six National Centers of Competence in Research. The University of Geneva is an equal opportunity employer.
