



Call for Small Research Grant Proposals for Potential Funding by ISPP

The ISPP Governing Council is pleased to announce a small research grants program, by which a portion of the income from ISPP investment funds is used for small research grants that further the goals of ISPP: to strengthen our organization; promote excellence in political psychology; and to increase the membership, diversity, and internationalization of the Society.

We now invite ISPP members to submit proposals for these grants for 2025. Specific award amounts may vary depending on the number of proposals received, but the maximum amount for any one award is \$5,000 USD. We will make exceptions to this limit in only the most extraordinary of circumstances.

We will accept any proposal related to political psychology from any ISPP member. We will look highly favorably on proposals that involve researchers in regions where funding for political psychology is harder to obtain and where the ISPP would like to increase its membership, diversity, and internationalization. We also encourage proposals for which ISPP funds would be especially helpful.

Members should submit their proposals to info@ispp.org We will begin evaluating proposals on Monday, January 6, 2025. Proposals received prior to that date will receive first consideration, and we will continue evaluating proposals until we commit all funds available for the year.

We will notify applicants that submit proposals by Monday, January 6, 2025 no later than February 28, 2025.

There is not a rigid format for proposals. However, please include the following components:

- The title of the project;
- The person or persons submitting the proposal, including their affiliations and complete contact information. If non-members will be involved in the proposed project, please identify which persons are ISPP members;
- A brief description of the project, preferably limited to 1500 words, including its aims, and why it is feasible to complete within a year or less;
- The background and significance of the project;
- A timeline for the project that lists specific activities and their timing;
- A plan for evaluating whether the goals of the project are met;
- A detailed budget, including funds requested from ISPP, a justification for those funds, and the likelihood of supplementary funding from other sources.

All grant applicants must be current members of ISPP. We will encourage all other participants in the grant-funded project to join the Society if they have not already done so. Grant recipients should provide the contact information for all participants in their project, and provide a report about the project and photos (when applicable) to ISPP.
