

**The University of Rhode Island announces Two Tenure-Track Assistant
Professor Positions:
Multicultural Social Psychology (#106332) and Social Psychology (#106365)**

The Department of Psychology at the University of Rhode Island invites applications this fall 2021 for two tenure-track Assistant Professor positions: one in Multicultural Social Psychology, and the other in Social Psychology. Areas of interest are open, and we broadly welcome specialization in a multicultural or general area of social psychology, respectively, which is of vital concern to society and offers opportunities for collaboration within our department and across the College of Health Sciences and the University. The positions will address teaching and research needs in multicultural and social psychology, respectively, that are central to our undergraduate BA and BS, and graduate curriculums.

The Department, College, and University recognize that the field of psychology needs to be strengthened by contributions from a broad range of perspectives. The Department of Psychology is committed to diversity, equity, and inclusion and seeks to serve as a representative inspiration for the next generations. As such, we particularly welcome candidates from groups that are historically underrepresented, marginalized, and/or excluded in the field of psychology who will support the mission of both URI and the Department of Psychology to expose students to different perspectives. Candidates will demonstrate a commitment to inclusivity to enhance a sense of belonging and academic success among students from diverse cultures and backgrounds.

The Psychology Department is recognized for excellence in teaching, scholarship, and service and for our strong commitment to diversity and inclusion. Our department has 800 undergraduates, 80 graduate students, and 28 faculty, with doctoral tracks in Behavioral Science and APA-accredited Clinical Psychology.
